



End of Key Stage One Assessments 2015

The average attainment for a child of this age is considered to be Level 2. Therefore a child who attains Level 3 has attainment higher than the average. A child who has attained Level 1 is considered to be below average. If a child does not attain Level 1 this is signified by 'W,' which denotes 'working towards Level 1'. Children working at Level 'W' are assessed against P scales which are not shown below.

What does this mean?

In Speaking and listening 85 % of the group were at the expected level.

In speaking and listening 34% of the group were above the expected level.

In reading 94% of the group were at the expected level.

In reading 34% of the group were above the expected level.

In writing 91% of the group were at the expected level.

In writing 23% of the group were above the expected level.

In maths 94% of the group were at the expected level.

In maths 30% of the group were above the expected level.

In Science 89% of the group were at the expected level.

In Science 30% of the group were above the expected level.
