Our Theme:

Temples, Tombs and Treasures

Welcome back to the Summer Term. We are all looking forward to working together on lots of exciting topics.

Literacy

In English, we are learning how to develop creative writing skills in myths and legends and poetry, and exploring the features of recounts, information texts, play scripts and persuasive texts, as well as promoting grammar, spelling and punctuation during every lesson.

Numeracy

In Mathematics, we are learning about the skills involved in calculating using the four operations. We will also work through activities in mass and capacity, money, properties of shape and fractions as well as combining these skills in real-life and word problems. Times tables will be learnt on a weekly basis.

Science

In Science, we are studying Sound and Electricity. We will be exploring how we hear sounds and how we can change the pitch and volume of sounds. We will be investigating how to build a circuit to make a bulb light up as well as which materials conduct electricity.

R.F

In R.E, we are exploring Hinduism. This will include looking at the aspects of Brahman that are known as the Trimurti. We will also learn about the different elements of Hindu worship.

Computing

In Computing, we are learning about how to stay safe when using the internet and studying the theme 'We are Software Developers' where we will develop a programme to make a maths game.

PSHE

In PSHE, we are learning about 'Relationships' and 'Changing Me' in our new Jigsaw programme of work.

P.E

With Mr Toothill, we will be completing activities in swimming; athletics; striking and fielding games.

International Primary Curriculum

We learn these subjects through our theme. For our themes we have an entry day to enthuse the children and an exit day to celebrate all that we have learned.

Our theme is Temples, Tombs and Treasures.

Our Entry day activities involve creating a scarab beetle as a good luck charm and making a pyramid in which to store things we consider as 'treasures'.

Our Exit day activity is a museum, which will open towards the end of term in July. We hope you will be able to visit to see all the wonderful artefacts we will have made and researched.

As Historians we will be finding out

- why rivers were so important to ancient civilisations
- what daily life was like in Ancient Egypt
- how to write using Egyptian hieroglyphs
- how the Ancient Egyptians might have built the pyramid
- about the treasures discovered din Tutankhamun's tomb

As Musicians we will be finding out

- about the instruments used in Ancient Egypt
- how to create our own music to help retell an ancient myth

As Artists we will be finding out

- how to design and create a tomb wall painting
- how to design and make an Ancient Egyptian headdress
- how to design and create treasures found in a tomb
- how to develop our skill in watercolour painting with sunsets

In International we will be finding out
