As part of our Exit day

English

In English, we will continue to have daily reading sessions. These aim to develop each child's ability to understand and discuss the language that they encounter. The children will work in smaller groups focusing on key skills across a range of texts. As a class, we will be reading Floodland by Marcus Sedgewick. We will be using this text as our starting point for a range of writing. Our written work will continue to focus on developing sentence structure through grammatical skills. We aim for the children to write for longer periods and develop the characters, and descriptions, in their writing. Their vocabulary and writing skills will be helped by regular reading of high quality books. We hope they can access these in school, the library or from recommendations. Spelling and handwriting continue to have great importance. The children will learn a spelling rule each week and practise this rule as part of their class work and homework. They will also learn a handful of words from the Y5 and Y6 list. All of these can be found in their new Reading Record.

Mathematics

In Maths this term, we will be continuing to develop our fluency with key mental maths facts, such as times tables, and a broad range of Arithmetic topics. This could be supported at home by allowing children to access Times Tables Rockstars as part of their homework. Our classwork will focus around the topics of Fractions, Decimals and Percentages; Converting Measures and Angles.

Science

Within Science, we will be learning about Animals Including Humans. This will allow us to explore the circulatory system, our heart rates and how this is altered by activity. Later in the term, we will further exploring electricity. In this topic, we will investigate variations on different electrical circuit components.

Geography

In Geography, we will be learning about the Water Cycle and the impact of water on land formation. We will be finding out about the local waterways, the principle rivers of World and the key features of a river system. We will be looking at the environmental impact of flooding and plastic pollution in the oceans.

R.E

In R.E., we will be learning how Christians believe how Jesus died to save them. We will understand the significance of Salvation and Incarnation in everyday life for Christians.

Computing

We will be learning about blogging in Computing this term. We will investigate blogs that are currently available online and use these as inspiration for our own.

PSHE

In PSHE we are continuing with our successful Jigsaw scheme. Our first unit is called 'Dreams and Goals' and this will help us set some targets to aspire to this term.
Art
We will be developing our drawing and painting skills. We will be looking at paintings of water by David Hockney, Monet and various other artists, and using these to inspire our own works of Art.
Cooking in the Curriculum
We will be learning how to cook drop scones.
P.E
In PE, we are focussing on developing balance and control in Gymnastics. We will be learning passing and Games skills through developing our Netball skills.
