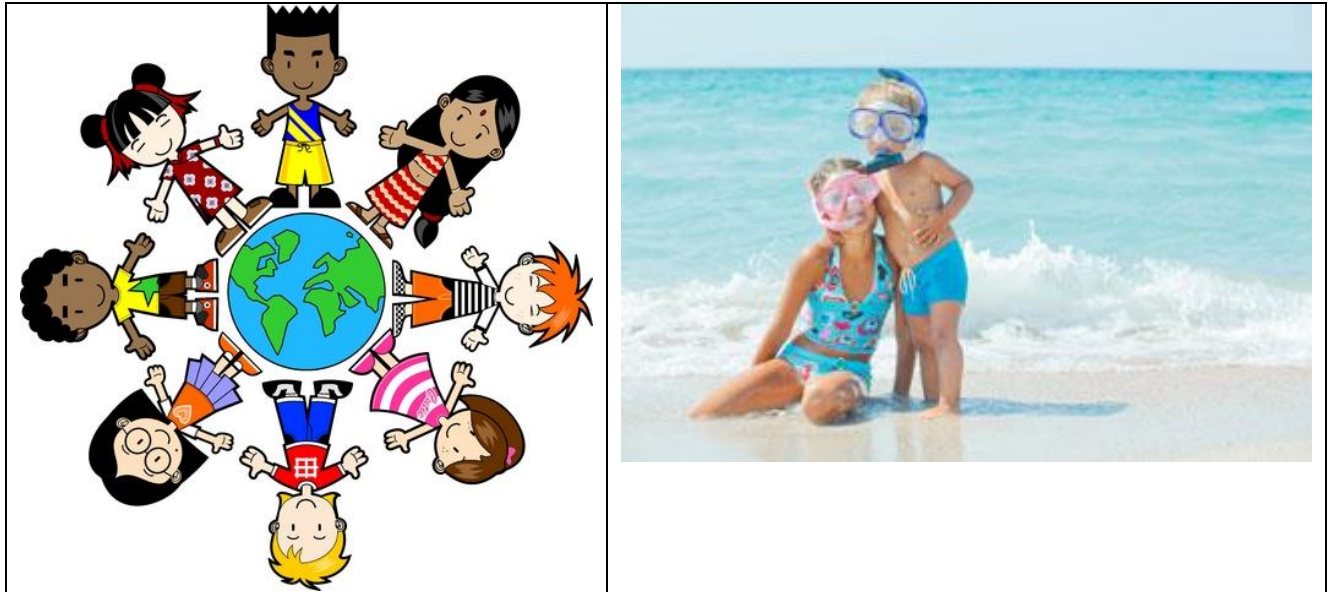

Welcome back Martins! I hope you all had a wonderful Easter break and ready for our Summer Term. We have lots of fun things planned in our learning! We will continue to work on our whole school targets of spelling and handwriting, so support with this at home is much appreciated.

Literacy

During the Summer Term we will be linking our literacy with our IPC topics and will be writing about our world including creatures that live in it such as nocturnal animals. We will also be looking at characters and describing them using adjectives. In the second term we will be writing about faraway places and poems based on a theme. We will also learn how to read text and answer questions that involves using our own viewpoint.

Numeracy

In numeracy over the two terms we will be learning to use our four calculations strategies to solve word problems. We will be learning about fractions of numbers and shapes. During the term we will be solving practical problems for different types of measurements. We will learn about position and direction and collect data and present it in charts and tables.

Science

During the first term we be learning about habitats and where animals live and even making our own shoebox habitat. In the second term we will be learning about seasons and weather changes. We will be conducting simple investigations and recording our results.

R.E

In R.E this term the children will be learning about the good earth and giving thanks; along with a bible stories week. We will learn how we can care for the earth and what God has created. In the second term we will be learning about different Christian celebrations.

Computing

In the first term we will be learning to be story tellers, whereby we will create a talking book that we can share with others. In the second term we will be learning to create a digital greetings card.

PSHE

This term we are learning to consider relationships and how we can work together to make them work. In the next term we will identify changes in our lives and how we can deal with them.

P.E

In P.E we will be learning to participate in striking and fielding games. We will also continue our weekly swimming lesson.

International Primary Curriculum

We learn these subjects through our theme. For our themes we have an entry day to enthuse the children and an exit day to celebrate all that we have learned.

Phonics challenges will be tested as they come into us. Please practice in these with your child as often as you can, alongside listening to them read every night.

The children will have the opportunity to read to an adult everyday in school and change their reading book. It is also very important they are reading at home to help them progress through the various different stages and improve their vocabulary which in turn helps them in their writing. Please understand that the children's reading stage will be changed when they have demonstrated over a period of time that they have improved their fluency and comprehension on that stage. There are a number of varied books for each reading stage and it is important that the children read a breadth of different genres. Before making the decision to move the children up a level, I always consult their National Curriculum reading level first.

We encourage the children to be as independent as possible in Key Stage 1, including developing their responsibility for bringing their P.E. kits, homework and spelling books on the correct day, and reminding them to change their reading books when they need to. We ask for your support with this.

We are always looking for parents willing to come into school to listen to the children read. If you can help with this it would be greatly appreciated. Please see me if you think you can help. If you have any questions please do not hesitate to approach me. I look forward to working with you, as well as your child.

Fingers crossed for good weather in the coming weeks! Please be ready to send a hat, water bottle and sun lotion into school so that we can keep your child safe in the sun!
