Our Theme: What did the Ancient Egyptians do for us?

Welcome back to the Summer term. We are all looking forward to working together on lots of exciting topics.

Summer Term 2026
Our theme is 'What did the Ancient Egyptians do for us?'
On our WOW Day we will be doing a variety of activities, including creating a scarab beetle as a good luck charm and making a pyramid in which to store things we consider as 'treasures'.
Our Exit Day will be a museum, which will open towards the end of term in July. We hope you will be able to visit to see all the wonderful artefacts we will have made and researched.

English

In English, we are learning how to develop creative writing skills in narrative writing and in myths and legends, as well as looking at explanations and recounts. We will also be exploring the features of persuasive texts, as well as promoting grammar, spelling and punctuation during every lesson.

The skills of using fronted adverbials, noun phrases and contractions form part of our grammar focus areas.

The knowledge of genre types, paragraph use and narrative structure will be consolidated.

Mathematics

In Mathematics, we are continuing to develop skills in calculating using the four operations. We will also work through activities in measures, including time, length and perimeter, as well as shape and statistics, combining these skills in real-life and word problems. Times tables will be practised on a daily basis, in preparation for the Government's Year 4 Multiplication Facts Check in the summer term.

The procedural skills for written calculations in number will be used.

The knowledge of units of measure and how to interpret data will be used.

Science

In Science we are studying Plants and Electricity. We will identify different parts of flowering plants, explore what plants need to grow well and the life cycle of the plant. We will be investigating how to build a circuit to make a bulb light up as well as which materials conduct electricity.

The skills of working scientifically will be used when carrying out experiments.

The knowledge of plants and how to care for them will be consolidated.

PSHE

In PSHE, our themes within the Jigsaw scheme of work will be 'Relationships' and 'Changing Me'.

The skills of turn taking in discussions will be used.

The knowledge of how our bodies change over time will be taught.

RE

In R.E, we are using themes within the book "The Lion, the Witch and the Wardrobe" as a focus. We will be exploring rules, good and evil and the symbolism of light amongst other things.

Skills in art, writing and oracy will be developed.

Knowledge of different religions from previous learning will be discussed and used to form personal opinions.

P.E

With Mr Toothill we will be completing activities in swimming, athletics and striking and fielding games.

Skills for swimming and team sports will be learnt and retrieved.

Knowledge of the rules of field games will be consolidated.

History

In History, we are exploring the Ancient Egypt, learning all about hieroglyphics, pyramids and the pharaohs. We will also be studying the importance of the river Nile and the delightful topic of mummification!

The skills of historical enquiry and primary and secondary evidence will be used.

Knowledge of this and other ancient civilisations will be learnt and retrieved.

Art

In Art, we are looking at tomb paintings and comparing them with the work of Banksy. We will design and make Egyptian masks, then use a variety of materials to create them. We will also be developing our printing skills.

Skills of printing and collage will be learnt.

The knowledge of how art was produced in ancient times will be learnt.

Music

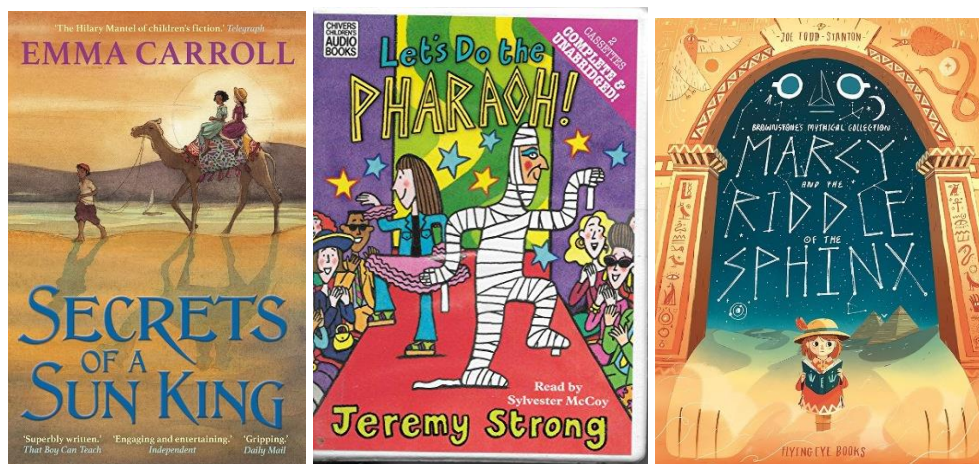
We are very much looking forward to learning a new skill this term – playing the ukulele! Mrs Ellis from Lincs Music Services will be coming in weekly to teach us.

Skills of rhythm, pitch and melody will be taught.

The knowledge of parts of the ukulele and what notes make up each chord will be taught.

Class Readers

Each term, we have a number of books, both fiction and non-fiction, that link in with our topic. These books are very popular and give us a greater hook and deepen our understanding of a certain era or area of the curriculum. We read these special books daily in our class. This term's main books are below. If your child has a copy of these books at home, they are most welcome to bring them in to school and read them alongside the class teacher at these times.



The Lincolnshire Show Schools' Challenge

Our school has also signed up to the Schools' Challenge run at The Lincolnshire Show. The Y3/4 team will be spending time designing and creating a pollinator and wildlife-friendly garden, which will be presented at the Show in June.

This is a very exciting project for us and we will be looking to include it in many areas of our curriculum including: writing, maths, geography, science, DT, cooking in the curriculum and art. It also will have an impact on our understanding of our locality, environmental issues, wellbeing and British Values.
