Welcome back Merlins! I hope you have all had a fabulous summer holiday and are all rested and eager to start our exciting new school year. I am really excited to be teaching in Year One and Two at Market Rasen and I am looking forward to getting to know each and every one of you. We have a very exciting term ahead of us this term and we have lots of fun things planned. Below, you will find all of the information that you need about the new topics, which we will be covering during the Autumn Term.

English

During this term we will be linking our English with our IPC topics and we will be using stories such as Robin Hood and many Aesop's Fables as a stimulus for writing. We will also be working on our handwriting and we are looking forward to the warm up exercises, which take place before each lesson. We will also be concentrating on spelling, grammar and punctuation in weekly lessons. In the second term we will complete lots of celebration activities, for example writing invitations and celebration cards. Please look out for each week's spelling rules in your homework and practice these at home. Reading is a big focus of our English this year as we endeavour to raise the profile and importance of reading. We look forward to using our comprehension skills during weekly whole class reading lessons. We will also begin sending reading comprehension homework each week. We hope you can support us with this at home, as this will most definitely have a positive impact on your child's learning.

Mathematics

In Mathematics this term we will be looking at number and place value to begin with, then we will move onto looking at addition and subtraction, measurements, properties of shape and statistics. We will strive to link our mathematics lessons to our IPC topics wherever possible, as we do in all of our lessons and will ensure that they are interesting, exciting and challenging for all of the children in the class. We will also explore our maths skills throughout many different contexts to enhance our reasoning and mastery skills. Look out for examples in your homework.

Science

In Science this term we are focusing on different materials and their properties. We will carry out different investigations to explore which materials are suitable for different roles.

R.E

In R.E this term the children will be exploring the topic of Creation. We will explore who and how Christians believe created the world and how we should look after the world we live in. Following this, we will explore who Christians believe God is and what sort of a person he is. We will explore the many different beliefs Christians have.

Computing

In the first term we will be Treasure Hunters and will use our programming skills to find treasure using programmable toys! In the second term we will be TV chefs and will be filming a recipe –we will use our thinking skills and use different software such as Microsoft Word and Movie Maker.

PSHE

Our Jigsaw topic this term is 'Being Me in My World'. We will be celebrating the differences between us all and we will learn how to respect each other despite these differences. We will understand that the world is made up of many different people and it is this which makes life so exciting.

P.E

In P.E the children will be taking part in multi-skills which will include striking, throwing and kicking. In term two they will be concentrating on multi-skills games, such as bench ball and other exciting team games. We are also looking forward to swimming again with Mr Toothill.

International Primary Curriculum

We learn these subjects through our theme. For our themes we have an entry day to enthuse the children and an exit day to celebrate all that we have learned.

Important Information

Our weekly homework will be set on Thursday and returned on a Monday. Look out for the new reading comprehension!

Our P.E day is: **Friday** and Swimming will be on a **Tuesday**.

The children will have opportunities to read to an adult in school as often as possible. If you have any spare time you can offer to come in and listen to readers please let me know! Help like this is welcomed with open arms!

We will change reading books on a Monday and a Thursday and will give the children two books at a time. If you would like to change them more regularly we invite you to come into the school after school and pick out some new books with your child. Equally, our Year Two children will be trained to change their own if they would like to. Please note the new books will not be written into diaries if they are changed by the children themselves. It is very important for the children to be reading at home in order to help them progress through the various different stages and improve their vocabulary, which in turn helps them in their writing. Please understand that the children's reading stage will be changed when they have demonstrated over a period of time that they have improved their fluency and comprehension on that stage. There are a number of varied books for each reading stage and it is important that the children read a breadth of different genres. Before making the decision to move the children up a level, I always consult the National Curriculum first.

We encourage the children to be as independent as possible in Key Stage One, including developing their responsibility for bringing their P.E. kits and homework in on the correct day. We ask for your support with this.

If you have any questions please do not hesitate to approach me. I look forward to working in the Merlins class this year and I am sure we will have a fantastic year together.
